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Kristu Jayanti University commemorates Kargil Vijay Diwas, honours fallen heroes

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Kristu Jayanti (Deemed to be University) commemorated Kargil Vijay Diwas with patriotic fervour on Saturday, as its National Cadet Corps (NCC) Unit organised a tribute to honour the courage, sacrifice and dedication of Indian soldiers who fought in the 1999 Kargil War.

The programme began with a solemn tribute to the armed forces and a remembrance of the brave soldiers who defended the nation under challenging conditions during the conflict.

As a mark of respect to the martyrs, Fr. Dr Jais V.

Thomas, Chief Finance Officer of the university, led the wreath-laying ceremony, followed by the singing of the National Anthem.

Addressing the gathering, Fr. Dr Jais V. Thomas emphasised the importance of remembering the bravery and selfless service of the soldiers who laid down their lives in the Kargil War.
