Kristu Jayanti Hosts National Educators Summit on Digital Leadership and Future-Ready Schools

“Teachers hold the responsibility of shaping future generations, and educational institutions must embrace innovative approaches to learning,” said Mr. Srinivasan Desikan, Managing Director, Qualplayers, Bengaluru, during the inaugural address at the 11th Edition of the National Educators Summit on “Navadrishti: Shaping Future-Ready Schools through Digital Leadership” held on May 07, 2026.

Mr. Srinivasan Desikan also emphasised the importance of Neuro-Linguistic Programming (NLP) in education, describing it as an effective approach to enhancing communication, learning experiences, and personal development among educators and learners.

Through expert talks, interactive discussions, and collaborative deliberations, the programme aims to provide insights into building innovative, inclusive, and transformative educational institutions equipped to address the changing needs of society and learners.

This summit, organised by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Kristu Jayanti (Deemed to be University), has brought together more than 120 principals, educators, administrators, and academicians from schools and PU colleges across the country to deliberate on innovative and future-oriented educational practices.
